





SHA Meeting Minutes November 12, 2013

Board Members Absent: Sandra Lambert, Board Member, Keith Mitchell, Board member, Gretchen Nestler, Board Member, Don Regner, Board Member.

Meeting called to order at 7:00 p.m. by President Henry Grace. Quorum was present.

Secretary's Report – Diana Martin - Move to accept minutes as printed in the Newswatch Newsletter. No corrections or additions asserted. A motion to accept minutes was made by Mike Bass, seconded by Bill Cornwall. Motion passed.

Treasurer's Report – Mike Bass – Total paid members as of this month is 588. This compares to 640 members at this time last year. The budget is in balance at this time. With present balance it is

expected that all obligations will be met through the end of the year.

Newswatch Report – Eldon Ledoux - The Company that has been used to handle services for the Newswatch Newsletter is going out of business immediately so a new company will be used going forward starting in December, 2013. This will result is having to have a new contract for these services at a new rate. Discussions are now ongoing with American Business Systems. It now costs around \$500 per month; however the new rate will go to \$643 per month. Future Newsletters will be tabbed and not stapled.

A motion was made by Kevin McNicoll and seconded by Tom Hirschey to stop the present contract immediately and start a new contract in December at a new rate for printing and delivery of the Newswatch newsletter. Motion carried.

Security Report – **Tom Hirschey** – We now have eight deputies doing patrol with increased hours for November and December. There were 33 shifts patrolled, 133 traffic stops with 94 traffic charges. Citations issued were 73 with 60 warnings issued. Vacation checks continue to go up each year as more



Holiday Shopping Safety

This year's shopping season is about a week shorter than we normally see. There is not less to do, just less time to do it. Some stores are essentially making Thanksgiving another shopping day.

Whenever you chose to shop, do it safely.

Before you go shopping, make sure you tell someone where you are going and when you expect to return home. Also remember there is safety in numbers. Shop with a friend. A single shopper is the easiest target for a thief.

When shopping with smaller children, make sure they know what to do if they get lost - go to the nearest counter assistant for help - and also make sure they know to never leave a store without you.

If you are shopping with older children, agree to a meeting point in case you are separated in a store or mall.

It's a good idea to streamline the contents of your purse or wallet. Take with you only the credit cards and forms if ID you will need for shopping. Also, always keep a list of all credit card numbers and the phone numbers to report them lost or stolen.

While you are shopping, be alert and aware of your surroundings. Never set your bag, purse, or wallet down. Unattended items are very inviting.

Be alert for "distraction thieves." They work as a team. One may distract you by bumping into you or engaging you in conversation while the other snatches your purse or wallet.

Plan your shopping so that you don't get loaded down with too many bags or buy the heaviest items first. Try to keep one hand free.

If you carry cash, keep it in a front pocket. Also carry your car keys and cell phone in your pants or jacket pocket. They are not only more secure from theft, but if your purse is stolen, you can at least call for help and drive home.

Don't leave presents on display in a parked car. This is very inviting to thieves.

Finally, when walking out to your vehicle, have your car keys in your hand to minimize the time it takes to get into your car. As you approach your vehicle, look around and look in your car before getting into it. If you are alone, it's a good idea to only open the driver's door. This will prevent someone from jumping into the car with you.

Have a Merry and Safe Christmas

A Few Safe Decorating Tips

A number of easy precautions may save your Christmas Season from a tragic fire. They are things you already know; little common sense steps we want to remind you of in your holiday decorating.

If you are decorating outdoors, be sure your lights and power cords are rated by UL, FM or some other insurance testing lab as safe for outdoor use. If they are, they will be clearly marked as such.

Whether decorating indoors or outdoors, check those power cords for cracks, brittleness or stiffness of the outer cover. When in doubt, toss it out.

Be careful not to overload extension cords. Follow manufacturer's instructions as to how many cords or strings of lights to plug together.

Keep a three foot clear zone around any open flame. This includes not only the fireplace, but candles as well. Never use candles other than in a candle holder or non-combustible receptacle. Even then, don't leave the room with candles lit.
